Canine and Feline Vaccines: Principles, Protocols, Pros, and Problems

Tear abnormalities are among, if not the, leading cause of canine ocular surface disease. This discussion will include a review of the precorneal tear film and highlight the importance of normal eyelid function in preserving ocular health. Discussion will focus on clinical features of tear disorders and resultant ocular surface problems that can be extremely challenging to treat. This includes keratoconjunctivitis sicca refractory to traditional therapy and non-healing corneal ulceration. Feline ocular surface disease caused by Feline Herpes Virus and other conditions will be covered as well.



Margret Casal, DrVetMed, PhD, DECAR (Reproduction)

Associate Professor of Medical Genetics, Matthew J. Ryan Veterinary Hospital, University of Pennsylvania, School of Veterinary Medicine, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania

Dr. Casal attended veterinary school at the University of Zürich in Switzerland. Following veterinary school, she obtained her master's degree at the University of Bern in Switzerland for her research in canine vaccines and virology. After working in pathology and research for several years, she went on to work mainly in small-animal reproduction at the University of Zürich for four years, where she developed her interest in pediatrics. To further her knowledge in this field, she pursued advanced specialty training in the area of veterinary medical genetics, pediatrics, and reproduction at Penn Vet. After her residency, she remained at Penn Vet to complete her PhD in the fields of virology, pathology, and gene therapy. Her research interests lie in genetic skin diseases of the dog and lysosomal storage diseases in dogs and cats. Her clinical interests are feline and canine pediatrics, genetics, and reproduction.
